# Choice Places Estate Issues



*Shrub bed at Loreny Drive soil is needing turned. John O'Connor have advised they will mulch this which will improve the look of the area.*



*Pathway at Loreny Drive is uneven  
– Choice Places is looking into having this re-levelled.*



*Grass now needs to be reseeded at Earlston Avenue –Choice Places ask that residents do not park on the grassed area.*



# Choice Places Estate Issues



Tree at the back of Caprington Avenue is beginning to encroach onto telephone wires – a works order will be raised to have this cut back.



Rubbish has been left on Sunnyside Square East – Choice Places will arrange for a contractor to collect this.



Caravan still abandoned on Shortlees Road – we are working with our partnership agencies to ascertain who it belongs to and have this removed – if you are aware who this belongs to please contact the office.

# *Estate Issues to be reported to East Ayrshire Council*



*Flytipping at Shortlees Road – we are working alongside East Ayrshire Council to have the rubbish removed and discussing how we can prevent flytipping in this area going forward.*



*Tree encroaching on to public footpath. This will be passed to EAC to look into who is responsible for having this cut back.*



*Rubble from tarmac on public footpath will be reported to East Ayrshire Council as this is a potential trip hazard.*
